DESPERATE FAMILY UPDATE AND CELEBRATION

Many of the people of this congregation took a risk a little over two years ago and



contributed over twenty thousand dollars to a family of five I called "Desperate Family." They used those contributions to keep a roof over their heads and food in their bellies. Without it, they would have been on the street even as they waited for a civil lawsuit to compensate the Mom for injuries sustained at her husband's workplace. Then, a grandbaby, Noah, came along, further stressing their limited resources.

I received some wonderful news this past week. The civil lawsuit was successful. They used the settlement to pay off legal bills, debts and health costs (over and above what OHIP covers).

With the remaining money, they put a down payment on a house so that they would have secure and safe housing into the future. It has a unit to provide the longed-for

privacy that Grandma and Grandpa have needed. It has a unit for their single son living with clinical depression to settle into dignity, safety and healing. It has a unit for Noah and his parents to finally have a space of their own without constantly bumping into the rest of the family.

The family wanted me to share this message with everyone. *"We cannot* express how much your generosity has meant to all of us. When we were alone with no one to give us a hand up, Kincardine United Church was the only place to offer help and compassion. You



may not understand how much we appreciate everything you have done for us. You kept a roof over our heads when we would have been homeless again. You donated furniture, newborn baby clothes, toys for Noah and the anonymous assurance that we were not alone. You were an answer to our prayers of desperation and of hope. You have truly made a difference for our family, keeping us together when we were ready to throw up our hands in defeat. **Thank you very, very much!**"

MINUTE FOR MISSIONS

DECEMBER 13, 2020

PROVIDING QUALITY EDUCATION IN ZAMBIA

In 2015, the UN adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which named 17 Sustainable Development Goals to end poverty. Goal 4, quality education, is critical for communities to develop innovative solutions to daily challenges.

According to UN statistics, over 265 million children worldwide are not enrolled in school. Access to education is a challenge in many parts of the world, particularly in rural areas, and it's one that Zambia's Mission & Service partners Women for Change and People's Action Forum are tackling.

Women for Change encourages girls and young women in rural Zambia to stay in school. The group works with national and community leaders to develop an understanding of the importance of education for all young people. It works with families, offering livelihood training to help address the economic issues that may be keeping girls out of school. It also works with teachers to support girls who return to school, and with communities to break down the cultural and social norms that sometimes prevent girls from completing their education.

People's Action Forum (PAF) also works with rural communities in Zambia to help them see how their resources can be used to improve local education. Collaboration between schools and local communities has turned schools into hubs of community health and development, including providing safe community water supplies.

Through a mentorship program called Girls Action Forum, PAF helps girls succeed by providing the skills, space, and encouragement they need to thrive.
