





EMBRACING AN ALTERNATIVE ORTHODOXY

Father Richard Rohr introduces an orthodoxy lost to much of contemporary Christianity – an orthodoxy rooted in Franciscan theology and practice, an orthodoxy biblically grounded, an orthodoxy which is personally challenging and ultimately liberating. Through five engaging

video segments accompanied by some thought-provoking hand-outs, this study will embark on a faith journey simultaneously ancient and modern. Each session includes a 10-15 minute DVD presentation by Father Richard Rohr, followed by a 10-15 minute filmed interaction with a small group of adults.





CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK IN CHINA (Feb. 7 update)

Amid increasing concerns for those affected by the coronavirus, The United Church of Canada has contributed \$8,000 toward the growing ecumenical response to the emergency in China. These funds will support Mission & Service partner Amity Foundation as they continue their urgent efforts to slow the rise of infections.

As of February 7, 2020, Amity has organized and transported nearly 300 tons of disinfectants, 10,700 medical protective screens, 713 boxes of various disinfection supplies, 3,000 goggles, 43,000 masks, 250,000 pairs of medical examination gloves, and food items to Hubei Province, which has been the hardest hit by the outbreak.

Christians in China are actively supporting Amity's emergency relief operations directly and through the coordinating efforts of Mission & Service partner the China Christian Council.



There is still urgent need for protective medical supplies and assistance. The number of infections continues to grow. As we pray for the sick and those who have lost their lives, as well as the families, caregivers, medical responders, and communities affected by this outbreak around the world, know that we are making a difference through our Mission and Service contributions. WAMPUM-NEECHI PROGRAM 2019

Our gifts for Mission & Service make the Wampum-Neechi program at Five Oaks Education and Retreat Centre in Paris, Ontario, possible. This week-long program brings together 10 Indigenous and 10 non- Indigenous youth (ages 12–14) for six days in the summer. They forge new friendships across cultures, enjoy summer days together, and learn about Indigenous (Haudenosaunee and Cree) history and cultural values.

The project's vision is for these young people to be continually engaged in activities, workshops, and play—all in a creative, learning-enriched, fun, and safe environment. Wampum-Neechi creates a positive space for friendships to grow, which in turn fosters healthy dialogue, reconciliation, and relationship-building between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people.

The adventure includes these activities:

- a trip to Kana:ta Village, a cultural centre
- spending the day in Six Nations of the Grand River
- learning Haudenosaunee and Cree songs
- learning about the church's role in residential schools and ongoing work toward reparations, healing, and reconciliation
- rafting on the Grand River, swimming in the pool at Five Oaks, and learning traditional arts, crafts, and games
