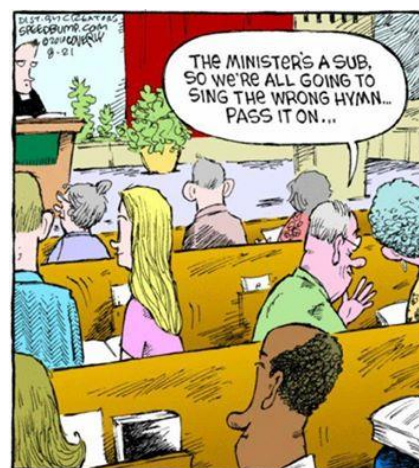

Join us at **7:00 p.m.** for a live streamed worship service to mark the beginning of this season of contemplation, of spiritual deepening, of study, of prayer and of fasting. 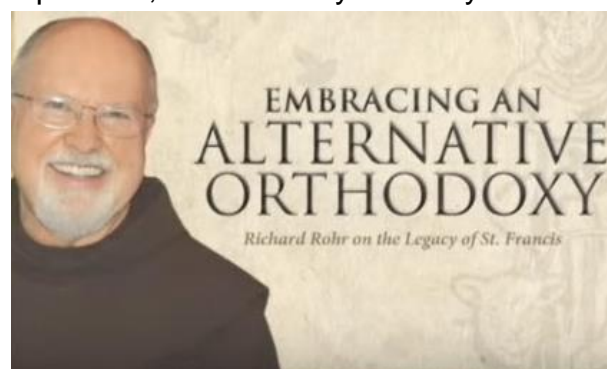

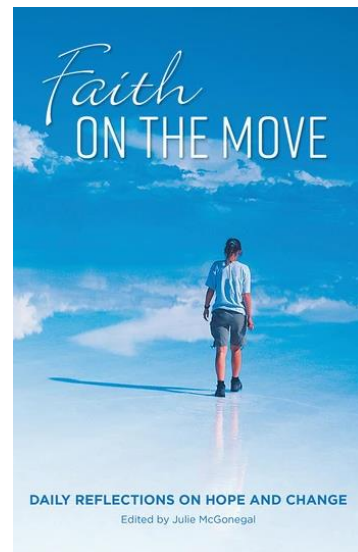
EMBRACING AN ALTERNATIVE ORTHODOXY – A ZOOM ENABLED STUDY

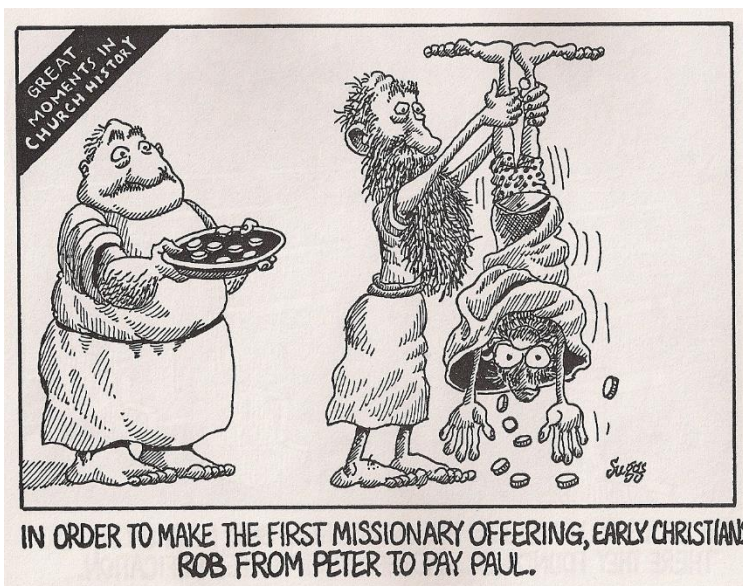

The webinar will be led by **Julie McGonegal** who is a writer and an editor who delights in language that dwells in the intersection of spirituality and social justice. She has a Ph.D. in English literature from McMaster University and has taught immigrant and Indigenous literature at various Ontario universities. Julie is the author of *Imagining Justice: The Politics of Postcolonial Forgiveness and Reconciliation* (McGill-Queen's University Press, 2009), and co-editor of *Literature for Our Times* (Rodopi, 2012). She lives with her partner of 25 years and her three children in Barrie, Ontario, on the traditional territory of Haudenosaunee and Anishnaabeg peoples.

Remember the creation of the Financial Task Group?

At the Annual Congregational Budget meeting in December of 2019, a Financial Task Group was mandated to work at discovering how to ensure our financial well-being as a community of faith into the future. This dedicated group of people worked at options for cutting expenses, increasing revenues and establishing a plan for the future. Here are the outcomes of that task group's efforts at the conclusion of their work.



- Creative ideas for future directions were shared with Council in September 2020.
- A Legacy Giving Ministry Team was formed by Council in October 2020 and two presentations have been shared during live streamed worship in December 2020 and in January 2021.
- An ad hoc small group took specialized training from our Stewardship and Special Gifts Officer, Rev. Dave Jagger, from November 2020 through January 2021, forming a tentative plan for the next two years. Dave will be checking our progress on that plan in six months to keep us on track.
