
contributions. Saves you time each week, allows you to budget yearly giving's, allows KUC to budget yearly donations as well.

EMBRACING AN ALTERNATIVE ORTHODOXY

Father Richard Rohr introduces an orthodoxy lost to much of contemporary Christianity – an orthodoxy rooted in Franciscan theology and practice, an orthodoxy biblically grounded, an orthodoxy which is personally challenging and ultimately liberating.

Through five engaging video segments accompanied by some thought-provoking hand-outs, this study will embark on a faith journey simultaneously ancient and modern. Each session includes a 10-15 minute DVD presentation by Father Richard Rohr, followed by a 10-15



minute filmed interaction with a small group of adults. No previous experience is needed. Sign-up sheets are available in the Fellowship Hall. Two times are available and interchangeable. Wednesdays in the Choir Room from either 2:00 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. or 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on March 11th ("Atonement Theology"), 18th ("Eco-Spirituality"), 25th ("The Cosmic Christ"), April 1st ("Orthodoxy vs. Orthopraxy") and 8th ("Mysticism over Moralism").
