


Each session will be approximately one hour in length

GRIEF RECOVERY PROGRAM

Huron Shores Hospice has a Grief Recovery Group starting in Kincardine on Wednesday, October 18 at 10:00am. This is an 8-week educational program and is not counseling. There will be opportunities to share with others who have experienced loss and participants will be asked to complete reading and home assignments based on grief recovery tools to help them work through their losses and grief. The book which accompanies the program is provided. Program costs have been covered by Huron Shores Hospice. Registration is required as space is limited.

HOME AT LAST

A Program to support aging, frail adults or people with special needs to settle at home upon discharge from hospital

The secret ingredient of this service is the personal attention given.

On discharge day, a HAL attendant will meet the patient in their room, support them through the discharge process and escort them to their home, in an accessible van. Once settled, the attendant can assist with errands such as grocery, prescription or medical equipment pickup, if required.

There is <u>no fee</u> for services provided by HAL, however the client will be responsible to pay for pharmacy costs and/or groceries.

The attendant ensures the client is safe and comfortable, providing Home Management.

Our HAL program also includes a next day telephone reassurance call, a complimentary 'Meals on Wheels' meal and more follow-up calls from HAL staff.
