ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE LAND

In our journey toward reconciliation, we acknowledge, this day, that we gather for worship on the traditional territories of the Saugeen Ojibway, and more recently the Saugeen Metis, as well as the other indigenous peoples who preceded them – the original nations of this land – and we acknowledge, with respect, their history, their spirituality, and their culture.

life itself and the weaving of each part of life into a beautiful whole; the seasons transforming and surprising with vibrant diversity; our weakness becoming purposeful strength when we work as one; times of boredom and frenetic activity balanced within your heart; death itself as the inevitable portal into new life and new joy; our very breath as sign and promise of your abundant love.
