INVITATION

#### **GREAT THANKSGIVING**

God the Creator is here. God's Spirit is with us. Lift up your hearts! We lift them to God the Creator. Let us give thanks and praise to Creator God. It is right to offer our thanks and our praise. O Great Spirit, from the depths of our hearts we give you thanks. From the place of the rising sun in the east, to the south where the warm winds blow, from the west where the soft rain comes, to the coldness of the north. We unite with all Creation from the four directions to remember the story. Generations past live among us - our grandmothers and our grandfathers whose spirits guide us and nurture us as witnesses to the story of our faith. Just as the ancient Hebrews were led to a "Promised Land," so, too, Indigenous ancestors were a wandering people. Just as the ancient Hebrews overcame danger, peril and challenge in faith, so, too, Indigenous Peoples encountered dangers they could never have anticipated. We, too, during our darkest and most frightening moments, pause in memory to offer thanks for sustaining faith. Just as the ancient Hebrews wandered for forty years in uncertainty and fear, Indigenous Peoples wandered for forty times forty years, eventually settling into the bounty of this new land,

We, too, have settled into this bountiful land to grow and to learn.

Just as healing reconciliation takes place within the tension of daring relationships,

so God's own self came to show us the Way of love

which welcomes the stranger with generosity and reckless compassion.
